Message for June from Revd Anne Davies

One of my favourite post Pentecost stories is the story of Philip being sent by God into the desert to meet up with an Ethiopian official; to lead him into a relationship with Jesus and to be baptised. I love this story for two reasons. The first reason is that this is how I was baptised. - I just responded to the invitation of the minister, my dad, who said "Here is some water. What is to keep you from being baptised?" and I decided that nothing was keeping me from being baptised. So I tied some string round my dress and in I went- and I have never regretted that decision. But there's another reason why I love this story. Up until now, in Luke's account of the growth of the early church, we read about numbers of people being saved, large numbers. We read that three thousand were baptised in one day and that "every day God added to their number those who were being saved". We read of Philip in Samaria preaching to crowds who, Luke says, "paid close attention to what he was saying". This was a great evangelistic mission time in the life of the church and then we get this story, God telling Philip to get ready and go out on a remote road in the desert. He doesn't tell him why but Philip goes anyway and there he meets one man; introduces that one man to Jesus and then baptises him. Can you imagine when he gets back to Jerusalem and people say "How many did you bring to faith yesterday Philip; how many did you baptise?" and Philip says "One". "What! Just one". "Yes - one."

The life and ministry of Jesus were full of stories like this- Jesus going out of his way to speak to and bring healing to the lives of 'ones'. He went, ignoring all the rules, to meet up with one Samaritan woman at a well. He called one man, Bartimeus, out of the crowd in order to heal him. He poured his compassion on one woman who was about to be stoned for adultery. Yes he sometimes fed five thousand at a time and taught crowds, but over and over again he gave his full attention to the 'ones'.

I am learning so much about the importance of the 'ones' every Thursday at Renew café. I am learning that the Question "How many? —"How many were there?" is the wrong question. The right question is

"Which ones – which ones were there? Which ones did God bring? Which ones did God bless? Which ones taught us something new?"

When we ask those questions instead of the "how many? questions, we are following the example of Jesus, just as Philip did.

Ruth Rice in her book A-Z of Wellbeing asks "Would you be prepared to keep showing up in a Renew space if only one person ever came?" We could ask that question about any church activity. If we are followers of Jesus the answer has to be "Yes", doesn't it? Which is great- because that 'one', those 'ones', include you and they include me. We are among the "ones" that God goes out of his way to love.

I cannot always see the path never mind the journey.


In times like these help me to call out to you as the writers of the Psalms did with a certainty of faith knowing that you are there, and I am your child. That is enough for me.
