Our journey as a church

Andy's sick leave began in August 2022, and - before we consider anything else - let's remember to hold Andy and Mary in prayer at every stage of the journey. This must surely have been the most difficult year imaginable for them and they must be foremost in our thoughts at this time.

Since August 2022 church services have been led by visiting preachers or church members. No services have been missed or shortened because a leader wasn't available. Music has continued at the heart of worship, provided by our own musicians, our visiting organist Graham, or (when necessary) electronically. There are always beautiful displays of flowers. Junior Church continues to thrive, and the Shalom fellowship meets monthly on Sunday afternoons providing services in other languages.

Weekday activities, both long standing and new, are still taking place. The Toddler group meets every Monday during term time, the Thursday Renew Café is very popular, and the Men's Group continues to meet on alternate Thursday evenings. The funeral ministry has picked up strongly since lockdown and outside groups are once more meeting on our premises.

The road Jesus travelled on his journey into Jerusalem was familiar to him and his disciples, but this time it was a unique journey astride a borrowed donkey and accompanied by cheering crowds. Similarly with our church, much that is happening is familiar and yet there is a uniqueness about the journey. At the moment, there is no clear outcome.

We shall soon be meeting with a moderator, who will help us to plan the journey. This is completely new territory for the church, and we will need to support and encourage each other as we face the

challenges ahead. Rev David Pile will be there to channel this support and provide guidance where necessary.

A summary of the April prayer letter of Pippa and Toby Vokuhl

The latest letter from the Vokuhl family was written just before Easter. It began with Toby's reflections on the sacrifice of Jesus.

This was the biggest act of obedience that the Father could have asked of him. The final test. Jesus **held nothing back**, and was obedient to death, trusting in God. Today, you and I and millions of Christians across the globe are His people, who will celebrate Easter with him for times and times to come...

One of the people of Jesus is the poor widow who held nothing back

when giving her last two small coins at the temple (Luke 21:1-14). And this reminds me that the current average daily wage in Nepal is just \$2, with rural dwellers much more likely to be in poverty than urban dwellers. The encouraging thing is that Nepali Christians gave generously even from the little they had to

gave generously even from the little they had to the recent earthquake appeal. **They held nothing back.**

You may remember that the family encountered a great deal of difficulty getting the right visas to stay in Nepal this year, and had to live in Thailand for several weeks. The good news is that they are now all back in Kathmandu, with the children in school, and visas that will enable them to stay for the rest of the year. You can imagine their gratitude and relief. They are particularly grateful for the educational opportunities the children have once again.

Toby also reported that the BMS are now giving thought as to whether there will still be a role for the family in Nepal beyond summer 2014. If they are to leave, they will need to plan their return to the UK.

Prayers are requested for God's clear guidance to the BMS and to them.
